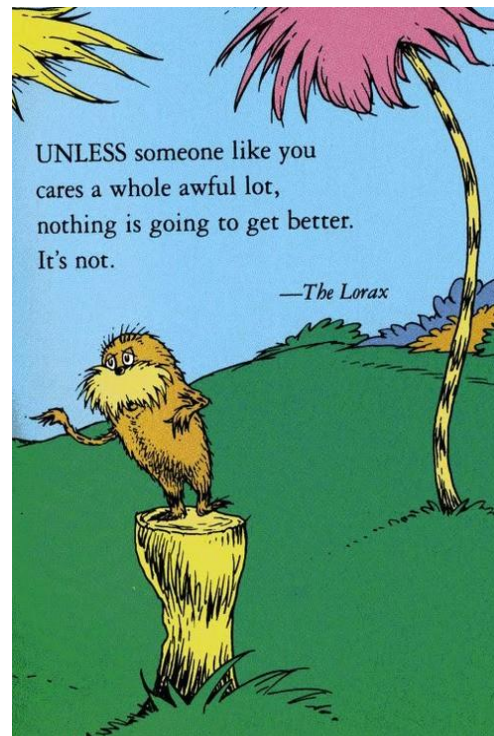

Why an independent commission against Corruption?

Unlike many other countries New Zealand does not have a single agency tasked with fighting corruption and has not seen the need to create an Independent Commission against Corruption. Instead we have a number of agencies each dealing with different elements of offending but none is dealing specifically with corruption.

In my experience it is currently impossible to report corruption, I know because for the past six year I have attempted to do so. Whistle blowers are penalised for questioning corruption and receive absolutely no support from any government agency.

While we the citizens are diligently held accountable for speeding, parking and other minor offences, there are those in positions of power who have no accountability at all.
